Social Media Policy

NPHA regularly reviews content posted by other users to its social media sites. All users are expected to adhere to site-specific Terms of Use when posting content to an official NPHA social media site.

1. The Communications Chair, Officers or designated staff team members are empowered to remove or hide comments that they believe may be offensive or in opposition to NPHA values, public health guidelines or evidence-based practice.
2. Groups or channels designated for members only are for members only, and if membership lapses, that member may be removed.
3. Pages or public-facing channels are the property of NPHA, and any officers that are Admins or Owners must relinquish that control when their term ends.
